What is the program cost?

Bethlehem Preschool is one of the most affordable in the Canyon Country area. Our preschool program is one hour longer than most programs. Tuition rates vary depending upon the schedule you choose.

Do you accept financial assistance?

What are the schedules options?

Bethlehem has 3 different flexible schedules with individual time frames. We have convenient hours: 6:30am - 6:30pm for full day students. See Tuition Rates form.

When can we start?

We are a year-round school with open enrollment all year long. Summer Day Camp begins mid-June through mid-August. Rates are the same throughout the year.

Does my child need to be potty trained?

No! We accept children that are not potty trained at additional cost. We will assist parents in the potty-training process.

Are snacks provided?

Yes! We provide morning and afternoon snacks. We are committed to your child's safety regarding allergies.

Is lunch provided?

Parents bring lunches from home. We have microwaves in each classroom and are happy to heat any lunch items for your child. We offer a pizza lunch option available once a week for you to purchase.

What type of Curriculum do you use?

The curriculum is designed to provide a variety of educational and creative materials to stimulate both academic and social interaction. Your child will learn and experience age appropriate academics, art, dramatic play, reading, language arts, math science, music, and outdoor play.

Do you teach Christianity?

Yes! Christianity is the foundational principle of everything we do at Bethlehem. The Bible story is reviewed in the classroom throughout the week. In addition, we have Chapel twice a week for Bible stories and songs.

How do you handle discipline?

Our teachers will treat your child with love and respect, using eye contact when talking with them. Corrections may include verbal, distraction or separation. It is our objective in this disciplinary procedure to bring about a willingness to cooperate, a positive attitude and a Christ-like behavior. No corporal punishment or violation of a child's personal rights are permitted.
